Inline with the amended Parent Payment Policy the costs for the annual swimming lessons will be included in the Curriculum Contributions category, however in 2024, due to additional government grants we have been able to subsidise these costs resulting in no charge to parents.

Educational items for students to own

In order to assist families, EEPS offers a service to parents to purchase student stationery items through an external provider. These items can be ordered online via **winc.com.au** and using the school specific access key, which is **2WX3Q** Alternatively parents may choose to provide or purchase some items themselves.

A list of required stationery is available from the school office or on Compass / School Resources tab (pencil) / Stationery Requirements.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Eltham East Primary School offers a range of items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides in order to deliver the Curriculum. These items include additional curriculum related excursions, incursions, whole-school events. Examples include; a puppet incursion, a visit to the Melbourne Museum, Japanese Studies Day and concert.

These charges are calculated on a term by term basis and are communicated via Compass towards the beginning of the new school year. These are provided on a user-pays basis. If you would like to purchase an item or activity for your child, please indicate this on Compass and arrange to make the payments as desired.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Optional extra-curricular items and activities- communicated to parents at the start of Term 1 2024.

Please also be aware that costs for activities such as school camps, Year 6 Graduation and competeting at District or Region Sports events are separate and parents will be notified in advance when payment is required.

Financial Support for Families

Eltham East Primary School understands that some families may experience financial difficulty. There are a range of support options, including the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund, State Schools Reflief and f payment plans for Extracurricular Items and Activities.

Payment via Compass is preferred. Payments via BPay, eftPOS (at office), cheque or cash are also accepted.

Refunds
