Student Leaders

Yesterday morning at our first assembly for the year in the great outdoors we were able to present the Year 6 Student Leaders with their 2022 Leadership Badges. Well done to our leaders and we look forward to their contributions throughout the year.

Teaching and Learning Tutor Learning Initiative

We are continuing with the Tutor Learning Initiative in 2022. This is an additional government funded program of support throughout the school. This initiative is on top of our existing layers of support throughout the school and structured teaching programs. Mrs Patty Casale will continue in the role all year with Miss Hannah McIntyre as well for the first half of Term 1.

Victorian High Abilities Program and Challenge and Enrichment Series

Two other government initiatives involve schools continuing to provide a range of stimulating learning challenges for many students. The Victorian High Abilities Program (VHAP) is for students in Year 5-8 for enrichment in the areas of English and Mathematics. Students for inclusion in this program are selected directly by the Department based on a range of data sets. The second initiative is the Victorian Challenge and Enrichment Series, which is for high achieving students from all levels and similar in nature to 'Gateways'. Mrs Mary Vescio coordinates both of these programs at EEPS and liaises closely with all teachers.

At EEPS our pedagogical approach has always been to 'teach to the point of need' and to provide appropriate opportunities for all students within the classroom environment. Participation in these new initiatives will add to our existing strong differentiation practices. Parents of participating students will be informed and kept up to date on their involvement.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools this year.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.

Mental Health and Wellbeing

What a wonderful start to the year! I have very much enjoyed getting to know all our lovely new Prep students over their first week at school. It has also been a delight to reconnect with other students, as well as the EEPS staff and families. Whether we are young or old, starting school or returning for

another year, our feelings about this transition can be mixed and varied. We might feel anxious, excited, energetic, overwhelmed and exhausted all in the same day! This is the nature of new beginnings, and the intensity of these feelings tends to dissipate as we settle in.

Now that we have successfully completed week 1, our next task is to build stamina. Here are some simple things you can do to help these first few weeks go smoothly:

• Being enthusiastic and letting your child know that you think they'll go well at school, sends a

positive message that school is exciting and that they'll cope and have fun.

• Try to drop off your child at school before the bell goes in the morning and pick up your child up on time in the afternoon, as being late can be the source of anxiety for children.

• If your child is worried about being separated from you, look for ways to distract your child at school drop-off. For example, you could try meeting a friend at the gate or walk to school with another child and parent.

- Be patient if your child wants to blurt out every little detail about school, or clams up completely. You could try saying something like, 'Tell me one good thing about your day', rather than asking a lot of questions.
- Remember that it's common for children to play with many different children and also to play on their own sometimes. It takes a while before they settle into a group of friends. Make after-school time a bit special, with a snack and time for you and your child to chat.

<u>3 Way Conferences- 'You, me and us'</u>

This year the 3 Way Conferences will take place early in Term 1, on <u>Tuesday 8th February and</u> <u>Thursday 17th February from 3:45pm to 7:15pm</u>. They will be held onsite, however there is an option of conducting them through Webex if needed for families. The 3 Way Conferences, 'You, me and us' will provide an opportunity for students to express their own views and thoughts on their learning strengths, for parents / carers to give their perspective and for teachers to provide their observations so far on the year. We would also like to help parents and carers to connect with the school and the learning program as early as possible.

The students will work with their teachers in preparation for the 3 Way Conferences, however you might like to reflect on some of these questions yourself, in preparation for the discussion.

What makes your child 'tick' as a learner? What are their strengths and weaknesses? How are they at solving problems and confronting challenges? What do they do if they get stuck with their learning? Do they enjoy challenge and extension? What are their interest and hobbies? How has the learning journey been for them so far? What obstacles have they overcome so far? As parents / carers what are your hopes, dreams and aspirations for your child/ren? What are three things that are unique to your child?

Please follow the instructions and allow 15 minutes between interviews for siblings. This ensures we run to time as you will have time for movement across the school. If you do require a WebEx 3 Way conference then please book the time through the Compass booking system **AND** then email your child's teacher through Compass, who will then provide you with the necessary link.

To attend a 3 Way Conference onsite, in classrooms, parents will also need to comply with the current vaccination requirements, (2 doses of COVID-19 vaccine) or have a medical exception evidenced by a COVID-19 medical exemption certificate issued by the Australian Immunisation Register. To assist all families, we will offer the opportunity to hold the 3 Way Conferences in person or via Webex. At the beginning of the 3 Way Conference, we respectfully ask all parents and carers to show proof of their vaccination in line with DET policy upon entering school buildings.

Parents attending onsite we respectfully ask that you maintain social distancing, and wait outdoors, where possible until your scheduled 3 Way time.

School Sport Victoria State Team Selection Trials

School Sport Victoria will once again be offering the opportunity for students with emerging talent from your school community to register to trial for school sport Team Vic teams in 2022.

Registrations to trial have just opened and will remain open until Monday 1 March, 2022 for Team Vic Big 5 teams: 12 years and under Boys Australian Football, 12 years and under Boys Basketball, 12 years and under Girls Basketball, 12 years and under Boys Cricket, 12 years and under Boys Football (Soccer) and 12 years and under Netball.

Please note that registration to trial for these teams is limited to 3 students from our school. If there are more students than 3 seeking endorsement it is up to the school to ensure a selection process is undertaken to choose the students most appropriate. Please express your interest in participating in these trials before the 22nd February to allow for this process, before registering your child and making payment.

These are not Come 'n' Try opportunities. They are a process for selecting a Team Vic State Team going to School Sport Australia National Championships. Attached is a Team Vic Big 5 process <u>letter for parents and teachers</u> to assist you in understanding the process for registration.

In addition to the Big 5 Team Vic sports, other sports available to primary school aged students this year within the Team Vic program include (eg. swimming, touch football and track & field). Registration details for these sports will be available on the School Sport Victoria website.

Please note there is a small cost (\$20-\$25) to parents involved in nominating your child. When considering nomination, please remember that the Victoria team is chosen from all Victorian students and not all students are offered a tryout.

Safety

Bicycles and Scooters

For safety reasons it is school policy that:

• Parents/carers are responsible for children riding bicycles, skateboards or scooters to and from school.

- Before the **age of nine or ten years**, children should not ride without adult supervision. Depending on their cycling skills and experience, some children over this age may still require supervision.
- Bicycle, skateboard and scooter security is the child's and parent/carer's responsibility.

It is vital that students travelling to school on bicycles, scooters and other wheeled recreational devices do so in a safe manner. Parents need to be confident that their child is a safe rider. It is Victorian law that helmets must

be worn while riding to and from school. It is School Council Policy that students are not to ride any of these devices in the school grounds.

The consequences for students who do not follow this school policy are that they will lose their chance of riding to school for a specified period of time.

Parents will be contacted where a child does not wear a helmet and/or has been reported to have been riding in an unsafe manner.

We ask parents for support in the implementation of this important safety policy.

Car Parking

The car park inside the school grounds is for staff cars only.

Parents collecting or dropping off children by car should park with careful regard to the safety of children and the free movement of traffic, either:

- On the north side of Luck Street
- Along both sides of Grove Street where permitted
- The small Grove Street car park is only available for parking during the hours of 9.30am and 2.30pm. The gates will open at 4.00pm for after school care pick up.

We ask parents to exercise absolute care in these restricted parking areas. The signage and designation of car parking on the surrounding roads is under the jurisdiction of Nillumbik Council. Parking officers frequently patrol these areas.

School Crossings

School crossings with attendant supervisors are provided in Main Road, Beard Street, Luck Street and at two points in Grove Street. Children walking to school or crossing to meet parents in cars should be directed to use the crossings.

Parents should note that these crossings are supervised by employees of Nillumbik Council and only supervised until 9.00am in the morning and 4.00pm in the afternoon.


