It is incredibly important that all of us have people in our lives that we trust, and all the more important for our children. From time to time, throughout the school, we do talk to the children about 'help seeking' for themselves and for their friends. A critical part of this is for each and every child to be able to identify 5 trusted adults for whom they can trust and seek help from. I would encourage all families to have this reinforcing conversation with all children. A fundamental aspect of child safety, in its many guises, is to enhance what are called, 'protective factors'. Being able to identify trusted adults to help is one of those protective factors.

## EEPS FINANCE NEWS

#### **Excursions and Incursions**

This year an Event for <u>each</u> excursion/incursion will be published on Compass for payment and consent as it occurs throughout the year. For your budgeting purposes, it is anticipated that the total costs for the year will be as set out in the table below. Please remember that swimming lessons for all students, and the associated transport costs, will be at <u>no cost</u> to parents this year.

Year 1	\$110 - \$120	
Year 2	\$130 - \$140	Includes day camp
Year 3	\$110 - \$120	Excludes camp
Year 4	\$140 - \$150	Excludes camp
Year 5	\$170 - \$180	Excludes camp
Year 6	\$250 - \$260	Excludes camp and graduation

These Excursion and Incursion charges are optional costs for curriculum enhancement. Parents are free to opt for their children not to participate and this will be handled respectfully and discretely. As per the Parent Payment Policy, children of families who opt not to pay by the due/closing date on Compass will be unable to participate in the event. Individual phone calls will not be made on the day of the event.

## **Prep 2023 Enrolments**

Prep 2023 enrolment packages are now available from the EEPS office and on the EEPS website www.elthameastps.vic.edu.au

Parents seeking to enroll their child are asked to provide their child's birth certificate or passport, their School Immunisation Certificate, details of any relevant medical issues including asthma or anaphylaxis plans and any other information that may assist us in ensuring your child's transition to their new school is successful. We also ask that you bring a recent gas, electricity account or rental agreement showing your address.

#### **School Enrolment Process**

Every year we have a high demand for places at our school and we will continue to grow in 2023. For Prep—Year 6, we are accepting children where we are your closest school. The **Find my School website** is a single source provided by DET to visually present all school zones throughout Victoria and to make it easier to find your local neighbourhood school or other public school option.

We are accepting all enrolments from Tuesday 1st March until Friday 17th June. From 18th July, you will receive a letter confirming your place at our school.


- · Families for whom EEPS is the closest state primary school will have priority.

## **Mental Health and Wellbeing**

Parents and carers play an important role in helping children to develop digital intelligence — the social, emotional and practical skills needed to successfully navigate the digital world. Even for preschool children, it is never too early to instil good habits, and as your child gets older it is useful to keep reminding them of these basic digital intelligence principles: respect, empathy, critical thinking, responsible behaviour and resilience. These are also principles you can emphasise with your child when things go wrong. To learn more about these digital intelligence principles visit the eSafety website. eSafety is Australia's independent regulator for online safety. Their purpose is to help safeguard all Australians from online harms and to promote safer, more positive online experiences. Their website includes guidance for:

Kids: fun activities and simple advice

Young people: help and advice for teenagers and young adults

Parents and carers: tips to help their children safely navigate the online world

The information and resources provided on the eSafety website cover topics such as managing screen time and setting age-appropriate boundaries, family tech agreements, hard-to-have conversations, online gaming and cyberbullying.
