#### A good blend- the right model

Last week Mrs Joseph and Mr Lloyd attended an Education Summit in the city. From time to time it is always good for school leaders to hear from different experts on a variety of topics. As part of the day there were a couple of panel discussions, both slightly controversial in nature. One was titled 'The Reading Wars' and the other one 'The Maths Dilemma'. Both were debating the 'explicit instruction' versus 'inquiry learning' approach. 'The Reading Wars' debate was keen to promote 'explicit phonics instruction' versus a 'whole language approach'. In 'The Maths Dilemma' it was promoting a 'explicit instruction' versus 'learning maths through investigation'. At EEPS we know that the best approach is one that combines all elements to provide balanced instruction for the children. It isn't a 'one or the other' way of teaching and learning for us.

#### **Kids Hope**

Following approval from School Council last week the school will be forming a partnership with Kids Hope. This will provide another aspect of social and emotional support in the form of regular mentoring for a small number of children throughout the school. We are excited to be able to provide this additional layer to our wellbeing supports throughout the school.

We greatly look forward to welcoming Prep grandparents and special friends on Friday for the Preps and to our EEPS Cross Country in the afternoon.

Parents are free to opt for their children not to participate and this will be handled respectfully and discretely. As per the Parent Payment Policy, children of families who opt not to pay by the due/closing date on Compass will be unable to participate in the event. 

# **Science Talent Search**

Dear Parents,

Science Talent Search Optional Learning Challenge

Eltham East places a strong emphasis on the teaching of science. To further build children's understandings of science, Prep's to Year 6 students are being invited to complete an entry for the statewide, 'Science Talent Search' as part of optional learning activities.

Over the ten years that we have been running the Science Talent Search we have seen an impressive variety of work produced and submitted by our students. This has resulted in many major cash bursaries, minor bursaries and certificates of merit. The theme for this year's Science Talent Search is 'Glass: More than meets the eye.'

The children have a choice of working on one of the three following projects: a creative writing piece, a poster or an experimental research project. If you want the opportunity for your child's entry to be considered for the official Science Talent Search competition you must follow the guidelines. The guidelines will be attached to the newsletter next week.

*First drafts are due week 3 term 2 and final projects are due in week 7 term 2.* This will give children an opportunity to clarify their ideas with teachers if needed.

Discuss all entries with our Science Talent Search Coordinators: Valentin Taburet and Sarah Coney.

The school is not able to send all projects to the statewide level as entries are subject to a strict quota. School level projects will be judged by Eltham East teachers according to the guidelines.

There will be more information to come in the following weeks and parents may need to guide and help students with the choice and direction of their activity; however, the work completed is to be the own student's work and will be judged according to strict guidelines. We will have check in sessions for students and teachers to ensure the projects are on the right track.

# Prep 2023 Enrolments

Prep 2023 enrolment packages are now available from the EEPS office and on the EEPS website <u>www.elthameastps.vic.edu.au</u>

Parents seeking to enroll their child are asked to provide their child's birth certificate or passport, their School Immunisation Certificate, details of any relevant medical issues including asthma or anaphylaxis plans and any other information that may assist us in ensuring your child's transition to their new school is successful. We also ask that you bring a recent gas, electricity account or rental agreement showing your address.

#### **School Enrolment Process**

Every year we have a high demand for places at our school and we will continue to grow in 2023. For Prep—Year 6, we are accepting children where we are your closest school. The **Find my School website** is a single source provided by DET to visually present all school zones throughout Victoria and to make it easier to find your local neighbourhood school or other public school option.

We are accepting all enrolments from Tuesday 1st March until Friday 17th June. From 18th July, you will receive a letter confirming your place at our school.

· Families for whom EEPS is the closest state primary school will have priority.


• If you already have a child at the school and we are **not** your closest school, please ensure that you enroll your child **before the closing date to secure your place.**
